DISCUSSION REGARDING TO USE THE ALLOWAY TOWNSHIP MUNICIPAL/SENIOR COMPLEX'S BASEMENT AS AN ALTERNATE EMERGENCY OPERATIONS CENTER

Mayor McKelvey told the public at the March 13, 2017 Finance Committee Meeting, Jeffrey Pompper, Deputy Emergency Management Coordinator in the Sheriff's Office of Emergency Management, provided the Committee with a proposal from the County Emergency Operations Center. The County E.O.C. is seeking the Township Committees approval to use the Township's Municipal/Senior Complex's basement as an Alternate Emergency Operations Center (E.O.C.). He stated the State would like the County E.O.C. to have a backup facility and they choose Alloway. Mayor McKelvey stated he doesn't see any disadvantages of being the Host to the County E.O.C. He continued, if anything it will benefit Alloway and the County. Mayor McKelvey noted the Township would be compensated towards phone bills and it can also serve as a backup facility for our own Emergency Management Coordinator. Deputy Mayor Patrick motioned to move forward, seconded by Committeewoman Reilly.

PROCLAMATION SUPPORTING NATIONAL POISON PREVENTION WEEK MARCH 13-17, 2017

On motion by Patrick, seconded by Reilly, authorization was granted for Proclamation designating the third full week in March as National Poison Prevention Week. Mayor McKelvey stated it is a way to raise national awareness of the dangers of poisonous medicines and chemicals.

PUBLIC SESSION

Mayor McKelvey opened the public session and asked anyone to come forward with questions or comments.

Warren Wieting, 36 Cobbs Mill Road, announced to the Committee there was another town that found lead in their water. He said he still doesn't understand why renters aren't required to have a water conditioner system. Then Mr. Wieting talked about National Poison Prevention Week. He noted, alcohol should not be overlooked. It should be defined separately. Mr. Wieting named Methanol and Isopropyl Alcohol. At that point, Mr. Wieting asked the Committee if they have noticed a lot of trees are coming down from the high winds we have had lately. He said it is due to the Southern Pine Bark Beetles. He said we need to make people aware. Mayor McKelvey thanked Mr. Wieting for his information.

Brian "Biff Crossley, on behalf of the Alloway Fire Department, thanked local fire companies: Quinton, Woodstown, Salem, Daretown, Salem County Fire-Police and Canteen 6. They were wonderful in handling an internal house fire. The fire went into the walls, then the floor and spread horizontal and vertically. Mr. Crossley said the fire was caught in time and the structure was managed to be saved. Mayor McKelvey noted that we are very grateful and appreciate all our emergency personnel who put their life on the line.

There being no further questions or comments, the public session was closed on motion by Patrick, seconded by Reilly.
