At 7:00pm the Regular Meeting of the Alloway Township Committee was called to order by P. Ed McKelvey, Mayor. The meeting was advertised in the South Jersey Times on January 5, 2017 in accordance with Public Law 1975, Chapter 231.

The flag salute was led by Mayor McKelvey.

Municipal Clerk, Charlet Cheeseman was also in attendance

Roger Garrison of Ranch Hope opened the meeting in prayer.

#### **MINUTES**

Minutes of the meetings held on May 17, and May 18, 2017, were reviewed by the Committee. Motion was made by Patrick, seconded by McKelvey, to dispense with the reading of and approve the minutes.

Roll call vote: McKelvey-yes, Patrick-yes Motion carried

#### **BILLS**

On motion by Patrick, seconded by McKelvey, the attached bill list as approved by the Finance Committee on June 12, 2017, was ordered paid.
Roll call vote: McKelvey-yes, Patrick-yes Motion carried

#### PUBLIC SESSION

Mayor McKelvey opened the public session and asked anyone to come forward with questions or comments.

Warren Wieting, 36 Cobbs Mill Road, distributed a handout to the Clerk and the Committee. He said the Committee has seen this chart in the past from him. He stated the chart indicates the activity of solar with the activity of the arctic air temperature. He stated the environmental issues have nothing to do with man. It has everything to do with the sun. The temperature correlates with the sun, not hydrocarbon use. He said CO<sup>2</sup> is essential for photosynthesis. He said it is Global warming. Mayor McKelvey and Committeeman Patrick thanked Mr. Wieting.

Brian Crossley, on behalf of the Fire Company, stated at the last meeting he expressed thanks to the Committee for including the Fire/Ambulance Company's parking lot in this year's oil and stone program. He stated he told the Mayor this information already, but wanted this information to be on record as well. He said when he took the information back to their meeting; he was informed that groundwater and possible septic issues in the parking lot need to be addressed prior to the repaving project. He said they would like a meeting with the Mayor to discuss grading changes. The Mayor stated he would have the professionals look at the parking lot. Mr. Crossley added the shingles are almost 30 years old. Mayor McKelvey thanked Mr. Crossley.

Theresa Pankok, 15 N. Greenwich Street, stated she is following up on her concerns about speeders in front of her house on Greenwich Street. She asked what the results were of the speed

limit monitor that was placed on Greenwich Street a couple of months ago, because there have been no improvements. She stated everyone is walking around in the village since the weather is nice now. Trooper, Lt. Quirk, was in the audience. He responded stating that unfortunately the last time the digital speed reader monitor was placed on Greenwich Street, he couldn't get the results from it. Therefore, he will make sure the monitor gets placed back on Greenwich Street. Committeeman Patrick announced that there are a few items the Committee is in the process of accomplishing to help deter the speeders. One of the items is of course to have the State Police monitor the speeding on the road as often as they can. Another item he spoke about is the possible shared service with Pilesgrove Township on the purchase of a large speed limit reader monitor. This monitor can be moved around within the Township. He said, it has been found helpful when used in the past. Lastly, Committeeman Patrick stated the Committee is looking into prices of smaller speed limit signs. These particular signs flash the speed of the vehicle and they would be placed at the 4 corners coming into town. Hopefully, the signs will help drivers to slow down. She thanked the Committee. Committeeman Patrick said he and the Committee know it is a frustrating matter and they are trying to come up with solutions. Committeeman Patrick and Mayor McKelvey thanked her. At this time, Brian Crossley asked if speed bumps could be put in the roads. Committeeman Patrick stated the roads are County roads and the Committee has already had discussions with the County about putting in speed bumps, but the County has made no decision to do it. Mr. Crossley said maybe the residents should go to the County to address it. Committeeman Patrick said he feels speed bumps or anything else would help and agreed the more voices heard the better.

Norma Simpson, Morris Lane, stated she wanted to bring a matter to their attention regarding the Board of Education spending money on frivolous legal issues instead of education for the children and it is actually interfering with the education of the children. She is very concerned as she has been a teacher at the school for 28 years. She said the quality of education at Alloway Township School has declined. She suggested the Committee look into the finances at the school between frivolous spending expenses and actual education expenses. Mayor McKelvey stated the Committee is very concerned for the school and he attended a few of their meetings. He thanked her very much for her input.

There being no further questions or comments, the public session was closed on motion by Patrick, seconded by McKelvey.
