ALLOWAY TOWNSHIP ORDINANCE NO. 496

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 3 OF THE TOWNSHIP CODE ENTITLED BOARD OF RECREATION COMMISSIONERS

WHEREAS, Ordinance Section §3-2 vests the Board of Recreation Commissioners (BRC) with the power to regulate the utilization of playgrounds, public parks, and recreational areas acquired by the Township; and

WHEREAS, the BRC has requested Section §3-2 Powers and duties, Subsection B. (3)(a) Recreation Exhibitions and Subsection B. (4) Collections, handling, as well as, Section §3-3 Township Committee duties, Subsection B. Finances, be amended as follows:

§3-2 Subsection B. (3)(a): Remove word "police" and Replace with: "monitor" and Replace with: "monitoring" §3-2 Subsection B. (4): Remove word "policing" and Replace with: "monitoring" and Replace with: "monitoring"

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED that in addition, the BRC has requested that Chapter 3-2, Powers and duties, Subsection B. (5)(b) Police power, be deleted.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, the Township Committee of the Township of Alloway, County of Salem, and State of New Jersey agrees with the recommended Ordinance changes.

If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held by any Court of competent jurisdiction to be unconstitutional or invalid, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

All Ordinances or parts which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Amendment to an Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon posting, publication and final passage in the manner prescribed by law.
