

The Regular Meeting of the Alloway Township Committee of the Township of Alloway, County of Salem was held at 7:00 p.m. in the Municipal/Senior Citizen Building in accordance with the Annual Notice adopted January 2, 2018, advertised in the South Jersey Times and the Elmer Times, posted in the Alloway Township Post Office and the Municipal Clerks Foyer in compliance with Public Law 1975, Chapter 231.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor K. Myrle Patrick, followed by the flag salute.

Rev. Jim Whitt, of Ranch Hope opened the meeting in prayer.

PRESENTATION FROM SOLAR RIDGE ENERGY

Mayor Patrick invited Wesley Hodges and Will Fischer from Solar Ridge Energy to come to the front of the room. They handed out a copy of their presentation on developing a small Solar Development on the Township's Closed Landfill to the Committee. They discussed the benefits of having a solar development within the community as well as past projects that have been successful. The Solar Development would generate power back to the community and Summit Ridge would pay an annual lease payment to the Township, and would own and maintain the solar array.

PUBLIC SESSION

Mayor Patrick asked for a motion to open public session and anyone wishing to speak, should stand, approach the microphone, state their name and where they reside, and briefly in five (5) minutes or less state your comments to the Township Committee.

On motion by Reilly, seconded by Morgan, public session was opened.

Brian "Biff" Crossley, of the Alloway Township Fire Company stated the President of the Fire Company went into the firehouse while it was raining outside and is happy to report there is no issues with the roof leaking. He also stated that the shingled portion of the roof is on borrowed time and he just wants the Committee to be aware. Mr. Crossley also clarified that the coin drop is only on Friday and Saturday, it will not involve Sunday and Monday. He also touched on the Mayor mentioning his concern on the shortage of volunteers within the Township, he wanted to make clear that there is a structure called mutual aid where companies from neighboring towns come out to help.

Joe Quather, 61 E. Main Street, asked the Committee when he could expect a response from his letter requesting resolution from the Township Committee regarding an on-going issue of the Township's drainage easement at the back of his property on E. Main Street. Mayor Patrick told him they are looking into what they can possibly do. He then voiced his concern on the group home on Telegraph Road for sexual offenders. He asked if the Township was aware and if it was a permitted use per zoning. Committeewoman Reilly said they were aware and it's legal. Committeeman Morgan said he was told it was a group home for five disabled people. He then inquired when the project on County road, Alloway-Woodstown Rd, was going to start. Mayor Patrick said they have it in the plans to do now, and that the county has had their construction meeting on the project.

Warren Wieting, 36 Cobbs Mill Road, stated he is concerned with all the tree damage in the woods from the last ice storm. He has warned us before and we are setup for disaster. He recommends residents with woods to make trails and to put the brush in piles to help slow down forest fires.

John Wagner, 37 Brickyard Road, asked the Committee if Comcast was required to offer service to everyone in the Township at a competitive cost. He spoke to a rep from Comcast and was told it would cost around \$20,000 to run service to his house. The Committee said this has been discussed in the past and has been an ongoing issue. He then commented on the presentation about the possible new Solar Development for the Township of Alloway. He thinks as small as the Township is, we should look into renewable energy as much as possible. He said the Township needs to find unique avenues to improve ourselves and to generate income wherever possible.

Mayor Patrick seeing no one wishing to speak asked for a motion to close the public session.

On motion by Reilly, seconded by Morgan, public session was closed.

ORDINANCE NO. 501**

AN ORDINANCE GRANTING RENEWAL OF MUNICIPAL CONSENT TO COMCAST OF SOUTH JERSEY, LLC TO CONSTRUCT, CONNECT, OPERATE AND MAINTAIN A CABLE TELEVISION AND COMMUNICATIONS SYSTEM IN THE TOWNSHIP OF ALLOWAY, NEW JERSEY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE OF ALLOWAY TOWNSHIP, SALEM COUNTY, NEW JERSEY, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. PURPOSE OF THE ORDINANCE

The municipality hereby grants to Comcast renewal of its non-exclusive Municipal Consent to place in, upon, across, above, over and under highways, streets, alleys, sidewalks, easements, public ways and public places in the municipality, poles, wires, cables, underground conduits, manholes and other television conductors, fixtures, apparatus and equipment as may be necessary for the construction, operation and maintenance in the Municipality of a cable television and communications system.

SECTION 2. DEFINITIONS

For the purpose of this Ordinance, the following terms, phrases, words and their derivations shall have the meaning given herein. Such meaning or definition of terms is supplemental to those definitions of the Federal Communications Commission ("FCC") rules and regulations, 47 C.F.R. Subsection 76.1 et seq., and the Cable Communications Policy Act, 47 U.S.C. Section 521 et seq., as amended, and the Cable Television Act, N.J.S.A. 48:5A-1 et seq., and shall in no way be construed to broaden, alter or conflict with the federal and state definitions:

- a. "Township" or "Municipality" is the Township of Alloway, County of Salem, State of New Jersey.

- b. "Company" is the grantee of rights under this Ordinance and is known as Comcast of South Jersey, LLC.
- c. "Act" or "Cable Television Act" is Chapter 186 of the General Laws of New Jersey, and subsequent amendments thereto, N.J.S.A. 48:5A-1, et seq.
- d. "FCC" is the Federal Communications Commission.
- e. "Board" or "BPU" is the Board of Public Utilities, State of New Jersey.
- f. "Office" or "OCTV" is the Office of Cable Television of the Board.
- g. "Basic Cable Service" means any service tier, which includes the retransmission of local television broadcast signals as defined by the FCC.
- h. "Application" is the Company's Application for Renewal of Municipal Consent.
- i. "Primary Service Area" or "PSA" consists of the area of the Municipality currently served with existing plant as set forth in the map annexed to the Company's Application for Municipal Consent.

SECTION 3. STATEMENT OF FINDINGS

Public hearings conducted by the municipality, concerning the renewal of Municipal Consent herein granted to the Company were held after proper public notice pursuant to the terms and conditions of the Act and the regulations of the Board adopted pursuant thereto. Said hearings, having been fully open to the public, and the municipality, having received at said public hearings all comments regarding the qualifications of the Company to receive this renewal of Municipal Consent, the Municipality hereby finds that the Company possesses the necessary legal, technical, character, financial and other qualifications and that the Company's operating and construction arrangements are adequate and feasible.

SECTION 4. DURATION OF FRANCHISE

The non-exclusive Municipal Consent granted herein shall expire 10 years from the date of expiration of the previous Certificate of Approval issued by the Board.

In the event that the Municipality shall find that the Company has not substantially complied with the material terms and conditions of this Ordinance, the Municipality shall have the right to petition the OCTV, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 48:5A-47, for appropriate action, including modification and/or termination of the Certificate of Approval; provided however, that the Municipality shall first have given the Company written notice of all alleged instances of non-compliance and an opportunity to cure same within ninety (90) days of that notification.

SECTION 5. FRANCHISE FEE

Pursuant to the terms and conditions of the Act, the Company shall, during each year of operation under the consent granted herein, pay to the Municipality two percent (2%) of the gross revenues from all recurring charges in the nature of subscription fees paid by subscribers for cable television reception service in the Municipality or any higher amount permitted by the Act or otherwise allowable by law, whichever is greater.

SECTION 6. FRANCHISE TERRITORY

The consent granted under this Ordinance for the renewal of the franchise shall apply to the entirety of the Municipality and any property subsequently annexed hereto.

SECTION 7. EXTENSION OF SERVICE

The Company shall be required to proffer service to any residence or business along any public right-of-way in the Primary Service Area, as set forth in the Company's Application. Any extension of plant beyond the Primary Service Area shall be governed by the Company's Line Extension

Policy with a minimum homes per mile (HPM) of twenty-five (25) in Alloway Township.

SECTION 8. CONSTRUCTION REQUIREMENTS

- a. Restoration: In the event that the Company or its agents shall disturb any pavement, street surfaces, sidewalks, driveways, or other surface in the natural topography, the Company shall, at its sole expense, restore and replace such places or things so disturbed in as good a condition as existed prior to the commencement of said work.
- b. Relocation: If at any time during the period of this consent, the Municipality shall alter or change the grade of any street, alley or other way or place the Company, upon reasonable notice by the Municipality, shall remove, re-lay or relocate its equipment, at the expense of the Company.
- c. Removal or Trimming of Trees: During the exercise of its rights and privileges under this franchise, the Company shall have the authority to trim trees upon and overhanging streets, alleys, sidewalks or other public places of the Municipality so as to prevent the branches of such trees from coming in contact with the wires and cable of the Company. Such trimming shall be only to the extent necessary to maintain proper clearance of the Company's wire and cables.

SECTION 9. CUSTOMER SERVICE

In providing services to its customers, the Company shall comply with N.J.A.C. 14:18-1, et seq. and all applicable state and federal statutes and regulations. The Company shall strive to meet or exceed all voluntary company and industry standards in the delivery of customer service and shall be prepared to report on it to the Municipality upon written request of the Municipality Administrator or Clerk.

- a. The Company shall continue to comply fully with all applicable state and federal statutes and regulations regarding credit for outages, the reporting of same to regulatory agencies and notification of same to customers.
- b. The Company shall continue to fully comply with all applicable state and federal statutes and regulations regarding the availability of devices for the hearing impaired and the notification of same to customers.
- c. The Company shall use every reasonable effort to meet or exceed voluntary standards for telephone accessibility developed by the National Cable Television Association (NCTA).
- d. Nothing herein shall impair the right of any subscriber or the Municipality to express any comment with respect to telephone accessibility to the Complaint Officer, or impair the right of the Complaint Officer to take any action that is permitted under law.

SECTION 10. MUNICIPAL COMPLAINT OFFICER

The Office of Cable Television is hereby designated as the Complaint Officer for the Municipality pursuant to N.J.S.A. 48:5A-26(b). All complaints shall be received and processed in accordance with N.J.A.C. 14:17-6.5. The Municipality shall have the right to request copies of records and reports pertaining to complaints by Municipality customers from the OCTV.

SECTION 11. LOCAL OFFICE

During the term of this franchise, and any renewal thereof, the Company shall maintain a business office or agent in accordance with N.J.A.C. 14:18-5.1 for the purpose of receiving, investigating and resolving all local complaints regarding the quality of service, equipment malfunctions, and similar matters.

SECTION 12. PERFORMANCE BONDS

During the life of the franchise the Company shall give to the municipality a bond in the amount of twenty-five thousand dollars

(\$25,000.00). Such bond shall be to insure the faithful performance of all undertakings of the Company as represented in its application for municipal consent incorporated herein.

SECTION 13.SUBSCRIBER RATES

The rates of the Company shall be subject to regulation as permitted by federal and state law.

SECTION 14.COMMITMENTS BY THE COMPANY

- a. The Company shall provide Expanded Basic or a similar tier of cable television service on one (1) outlet at no cost to each qualified existing and future school in the Municipality, public and private, elementary, intermediate and secondary, provided the school is within 250 feet of active cable distribution plant. Each additional outlet installed, if any, shall be paid for on a materials plus labor basis by the school requesting service. Monthly service charges shall be waived on all additional outlets.
- b. The Company shall provide Expanded Basic or a similar tier of cable television service at no cost on one (1) outlet to Township Hall, each qualified existing and future police, fire, emergency management facility and public library in the Municipality, provided the facility is located within 250 feet of active cable distribution plant. Each additional outlet installed, if any, shall be paid for on a materials plus labor basis by the Municipality. Monthly service charges shall be waived on all additional outlets.
- c. The Communications Act of 1934, as amended [47 U.S.C. §543 (b)], allows the Company to itemize and/or identify: (1.) the amount on the subscriber bill assessed as a franchise fee and the identity of the governmental authority to which the fee is paid; (2.) the amount on the bill assessed to satisfy any requirements imposed on the Company by the cable franchise to support public, educational, and/or governmental access channels or the use of such channels; and (3.) any grants or other fees on the bill or any tax, assessment, or

charge of any kind imposed by any governmental authority on the transaction between the operator and the subscriber. The Company reserves these external cost, pass-through rights to the extent permitted by law.

- d. Company representatives shall appear at least once annually, upon reasonable written request of the Governing Body, at a public meeting of the Governing Body to discuss matters pertaining to the provision of cable service to residents of the Township and other cable-related issues as the Township and Company may see fit to discuss.

SECTION 15. EMERGENCY USES

- a. The Company will comply with the Emergency Alert System ("EAS") rules in accordance with applicable state and federal statutes and regulations.
- b. The Company shall in no way be held liable for any injury suffered by the municipality or any other person, during an emergency, if for any reason the Municipality is unable to make full use of the cable television system as contemplated herein.

SECTION 16. LIABILITY INSURANCE

The Company shall at all times maintain a comprehensive general liability insurance policy with a single limit amount of \$1,000,000 covering liability for any death, personal injury, property damages or other liability arising out of its construction and operation of the cable television system, and an excess liability (or "umbrella") policy in the amount of \$5,000,000.

SECTION 17. INCORPORATION OF THE APPLICATION

All of the statements and commitments contained in the Application or annexed thereto and incorporated therein, and any amendment thereto, except as modified herein, are binding upon the Company as terms and conditions of this consent. The Application and other relevant writings

submitted by the Company shall be annexed hereto and made a part hereof by reference provided same do not conflict with applicable State or Federal law.

SECTION 18. COMPETITIVE EQUITY

Should the Municipality grant a franchise to construct, operate and maintain a cable television system to any other person, corporation or entity on terms materially less burdensome or more favorable than the terms contained herein, the Company may substitute such language that is more favorable or less burdensome for the comparable provision of this Ordinance subject to the provisions of N.J.A.C. 14:17-6.7.

SECTION 19. SEPARABILITY

If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this Ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any court or federal or state agency of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision, and its validity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of the Ordinance.


SECTION 20. THIRD PARTY BENEFICIARIES

Nothing in this Franchise or in any prior agreement is or was intended to confer third-party beneficiary status on any member of the public to enforce the terms of such agreements or Franchise.

SECTION 21. EFFECTIVE DATE

This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon issuance of a Renewal Certificate of Approval from the BPU.



**AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE POSITION OF TOWNSHIP
ADMINISTRATOR FOR THE TOWNSHIP OF ALLOWAY**

WHEREAS, by the Township Committee of the Township of Alloway, Salem County, State of New Jersey that the position of Township Administrator is hereby established; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED that said Ordinance amends Chapter 18 of the Alloway Township Municipal Code entitled: Officers and Employers and Article XI establishing Township Administrator position is added as follows:

§18-23. Establishment of Township Administrator Position.

Pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:9-136 et seq., the position of Township Administrator for the Township of Alloway is hereby established.

§18-24. Appointment, Term, Vacancy, Absence, Removal and Service; Acting Administrator.

The Township Committee shall appoint the Township Administrator in accordance with N.J.S.A. 40A:9-137 by majority of its members.

The term of office of Township Administrator shall be one year for the initial appointment. All subsequent appointments shall be for a term of three years.

Any vacancy in said office shall be filled by appointment of the Township Committee for the unexpired term by majority vote of its members.

During the absence or disability of the Township Administrator, the Township Committee may, by resolution, appoint an officer or regular employee of the municipality to perform such duties of the Township Administrator during his/her absence or disability. Such absence or disability shall be limited to three months, after which time such absence or disability may be deemed a vacancy.

The Township Administrator may be removed from office by majority vote of the members of the Township Committee. The resolution of removal shall become effective one month after its adoption by the Township Committee. The Township Committee may provide that the resolution shall have immediate effect, provided however, that in such event (immediate termination) the Township Committee shall cause to be paid to the Township Administrator any unpaid balances of his/her salary and his/her salary for the next 90 days following the adoption of the resolution.

§18-25. Qualifications and Residence.

The Administrator shall possess such qualifications as the Township Committee deems necessary for the management and administration of the Township of Alloway.

The Administrator shall not be required to be a resident of the Township of Alloway.

§18-26. Participation in Political Campaigns.

The Township Administrator shall not engage in any organized political campaigns within the Township of Alloway.

§18-27. Compensation.

The Township Administrator shall receive as compensation such sum as may be fixed and adopted by the Township Committee in the Annual Salary Ordinance of the Township.[1]
[1]

Editor's Note: Said annual ordinance is on file in the office of the Township Clerk.

§18-28. Powers and Duties.

The Township Administrator shall be the Chief Administrative Officer of the Township of Alloway and he/she shall be responsible to the Township Committee for proper and efficient administration of the business affairs of the Township. His/her duties and responsibilities shall relate to the general management of all Township business, excepting those duties and responsibilities conferred upon other Township official by statute, other applicable laws, rules and regulation promulgated by the state and county agencies, case decisions or ordinances of the Township of Alloway.

§18-29. Administrative, Supervision and Direction.

The Township Administrator shall coordinate the business activities of all municipal departments and shall be authorized to require that all department heads submit to him/her periodic reports on the operation of their departments. All municipal departments, except where expressly prohibited by law, shall be subject to the direction and supervision of the Township Administrator.

§18-30. Budget Preparation.

The Township Administrator, in cooperation with the Chief Financial Officer, shall prepare the municipal budget. In preparing the proposed budget, the Township Administrator or an officer designated by him/her shall obtain from the head of each department, agency or board or office, estimates of revenues and expenditures and other support data as he/she requests for the ensuing budget year.

§18-31. General Powers and Duties.

The Township Administrator shall have the following general powers and duties:

A.

Attend all meetings of the Township Committee and such other meetings as directed with the right to take part in discussions, but without the right to vote.

B.

Keep the Township Committee informed as to the conduct of the Township affairs.

C.

Submit periodic reports, either in writing or orally, on the condition of the Township affairs and finances, and such other reports, either in writing or orally, as the Township Committee shall request.

D.

Make such recommendations to the Township Committee as reasonably necessary and advisable for the welfare of the Township.

E.

Keep the Township Committee informed about federal and state aid projects and any other aid program for which the Township may qualify.

F.

In cooperation with all department heads, conduct appropriate studies of all activities and operations of the Township government and recommend to the Township Committee changes for the purpose of increasing efficiency, economy and effectiveness of operation.

G.

Study, recommend, implement and enforce procedures and policies for the compiling, editing and prompt dissemination and release of public information upon the recommendation and authorization of the Township Committee.

H.

Ensure that the provisions of all franchises, leases, permits and privileges granted to the Township Committee are complied with by action of the proper municipal official and, upon knowledge of any violation or breach, call same to the attention of the Township Committee.

I.

Recommend the employment of consultants to perform work and render advice on special projects in the Township, subject to approval by the Township Committee.

J.

Review all complaints regarding the functions, obligations, services or personnel of the Township not specifically addressed to any other official in the Township. Investigate and dispose of such complaints and keep a written record of such complaints and when and what action was taken in response thereto, and provide to the Township Committee a copy thereof upon request.

K.

Coordinate the activities related to the letting of contracts and supervise the performance and execution of same, except insofar as such duties are expressly imposed on some other Township officer or official by statute.

L.

Promptly receive copies from the Township Clerk, formulate the agenda for each executive meeting of the Township Committee and supply facts pertinent thereto to the Township Committee.

§18-32. Scope of Office.

The Township Administrator shall devote full time to the interest of the Township and shall not hold any other employment except when designated by the Township Committee.

§18-33. Exercise of Statutory Powers and Duties.

Nothing in this article shall derogate from or authorize the Township Administrator to exercise the statutory powers and duties of the elected and appointed officials of the Township.


§18-34. Repeal of Prior or Inconsistent Ordinances.

TO BE USED FOR THE RECONSTRUCTION OF PIERSON ROAD, SECTION II
WITHIN THE TOWNSHIP OF ALLOWAY, COUNTY OF SALEM,
STATE OF NEW JERSEY**

WHEREAS, the Governing Body desires to authorize the Reconstruction of Pierson Road, Section II with the Township of Alloway, and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED by the Township Committee of the Township of Alloway, County of Salem and State of New Jersey, that:

SECTION 1: There is hereby appropriated from the following sources the sum of \$135,000.00 to be used for the following capital project within the Township of Alloway:

<u>Purpose/Improvement</u>	<u>Estimated Cost</u>	<u>Grants</u>	<u>Period of Usefulness</u>
Reconstruction of Pierson Road, Section II	\$135,000.00	NJDOT \$135,000.00	10 years


SECTION 2: In connection with the amounts authorized in Section 1, the township makes the following determinations:

- a. The purpose described in Section 1 is not a Current Expense and is an improvement, which the Township may lawfully make as a general improvement.
- b. The period of usefulness of the purpose described in Section 1 hereof is within the limitations of the Local Bond Law and according to the reasonable life thereof is (5) years or more.
- c. No debt is authorized by this Ordinance
- d. The capital budget of the Township is hereby amended.

SECTION 3: All ordinances or parts of ordinances that are inconsistent with the terms of this ordinance be and the same are hereby repealed to the extent of their inconsistency.

SECTION 4: This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon proper passage, publication in accordance with law and after final adoption as provided by law.


