Debbie Warren, 69 Pierson Road would like to see the intersection at Watson Mill Road and Commissioners Pike a 4 way stop because there have been serious accidents at the intersection. She stated there have been 7 accidents in the last 3 years at that intersection. She provided the Committee members with a list she received from the State Police which indicates the details of the accidents. The Committee agreed that this intersection is dangerous. She said she went to the County meeting last night and she was told to bring this information to the Township Committee. Mayor McKelvey informed her that these roads are County roads and the County has a procedure for requests. Mayor McKelvey said the Committee needs to make a formal request to make Watson Mill Road and Commissioners Pike into a 4 way stop. The Resolution will be placed on the April Township Committee meeting agenda. Ms. Warren asked what happens after the request is made. The Mayor stated the County will make the final decision.

The Mayor stated that the Alloway Lake has been lowered 2 feet. It has allowed bulkhead exposure but not for some docks, so some residents haven't been able to do work on their dock. He informed the public that the watering lowering permit is issued and the level is set by the NJ DEP and the Township has to abide by the permit. The reason for lowering the water of the lake is to maintain aquatic life in the watershed below the dam.

He also stated that along with Deputy Mayor Patrick, he attended a meeting with the Fire Company about their future.

He will be attending the JIF meeting on Monday.

**ALLOWAY TOWNSHIP
ORDINANCE NO. 515**

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 21 ARTICLE I. ENTITLED
"PERSONNEL POLICIES-ROAD DEPARTMENT EMPLOYEES"**

WHEREAS, changes were made previously to Section § 21-5. Holidays and Section § 21-12. Sick Leave in Chapter 21 Article I. Road Department Employees and were formalized by Resolutions; however, amendments to said ordinance were not enacted; and

WHEREAS, the Township Committee decided there was a need to update Sections § 21-4. Overtime Pay and § 21-9. Carry over of vacation time in Chapter 21 Article I, as well.

NOW BE IT ORDAINED by the Township Committee of the Township of Alloway County of Salem, and State of New Jersey that the aforesaid Sections be deleted and replaced as stated below.

Article I. Road Department Employees

§ 21-4. Overtime Pay.

The Township Committee reserves the right to grant compensatory time in lieu of overtime pay. All compensatory time must be taken by the employee within 30 days of earning same unless permission for an extension is granted by the Personnel Chair.

The Township will **not** recognize or provide compensation for a work time over and above an employee's scheduled work time unless said overtime:

- Is an emergency and is required as part of an employee's job function or activities
- The overtime has been authorized by the Personnel Chair

Employees will receive one and one-half (1 1/2) hours of overtime compensation for each hour worked in excess of forty (40) hours in a weekly period.

§ 21-5. Holidays.

Full-time Road Department employees shall be allotted 12 holidays with pay, as follows: New Year's Day, Martin Luther King's Birthday, Presidents Day, Good Friday, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Columbus Day, Veterans Day, Thanksgiving Day, Day after Thanksgiving and Christmas Day. A holiday falling on a Saturday will be observed on the preceding Friday, and a holiday falling on a Sunday will be observed on the following Monday.

If an employee has taken an unexcused absence on the first workday preceding or the first workday following any of the holidays listed above, the employee shall not receive pay for that holiday, unless a doctor's note is provided.

§ 21-9. Carry over of vacation time.

No more than one (1) week of vacation time earned in a year can be carried over to the following year and must be approved by the employee's immediate supervisor or the Personnel Chair and must be used in the following year. Records concerning vacation days shall be kept by the Finance Officer, acting as timekeeper. In the event of death or separation, these banked, unused vacation days shall be paid for to the employee or their legal heir or heirs at the then-current rate of compensation (rate of pay obtaining at the time of death or separation). Upon termination of employment, vacation time will be pro-rated based upon the number of full months worked. If more vacation time has been taken than earned, the excess days will be deducted from the employee's final pay. Likewise, carry over days, if any, and unused pro-rated earned vacation time will be added to the employee's final pay.

§ 21-12. Sick leave.

Effective January 1, 2016, each full-time employee shall be entitled to a maximum of five (5) workdays with pay at regular rate per calendar year when absent due to illness, with no carryover of unused sick days from year to year. Employees absent on sick leave for (3) three or more consecutive working days must submit a doctor's verification of illness or injury. After the (5) fifth day of absence on sick leave in one (1) calendar year, a doctor's verification may be requested all sick leave absences, regardless of duration. Prior to the return to work, the Township may require an employee to be examined by a physician designated by the Township to verify fitness to return to normal duties. An employee will not be permitted to return to work until the verification is received. During the probationary period, employees shall not be eligible for paid sick leave.

If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held by any Court of competent jurisdiction to be unconstitutional or invalid, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

All Ordinances or parts which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Amendment to an Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon posting, publication and final passage in the manner prescribed by law.
