

The Regular Meeting of the Alloway Township Committee of the Township of Alloway, County of Salem was held at 7:00 p.m. in the Municipal/Senior Citizen Building in accordance with the Annual Notice adopted January 2, 2019, advertised in the South Jersey Times and the Elmer Times, posted in the Alloway Township Post Office and the Municipal Clerks Foyer in compliance with Public Law 1975, Chapter 231.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor P. Ed McKelvey, followed by the flag salute.

Rev. Ellen Cusack of Alloway Methodist Church opened the meeting in prayer.

MINUTES

Minutes of the following meetings were reviewed by the Committee. Motion was made by Patrick, seconded by Morgan, to dispense with the reading of and approve the minutes.

BILLS

On motion by Patrick, seconded by Morgan, the attached bill list was approved by the Finance Committee on July 15, 2019 and was ordered paid.

PRESENTATION

Mayor McKelvey invited Theodore Baker, Cumberland County Counsel, up to the front of the room to update the Township regarding the results from residents who did the Wi-Fi speed test. Mr. Baker has been assisting the Township in pursuing fiber from Verizon for qualifying Alloway residents. He stated that the Township is short on the number of qualified residents needed and suggested that residents talk to their neighbor's and tell them that their help is needed to get the 35 qualifying residents that is required. The Verizon BFRR application is available on the Township's website for residents who did not receive one and would like to submit one. He told residents to email him directly with any complaints or questions.

Mayor McKelvey thanked Mr. Baker for attending the meeting and for all his help.

PRESENTATION

Mayor McKelvey invited Ryan Jones up to the front of the room. He is a resident of Alloway and presented his idea for a trash pickup option for Alloway Township residents. Mr. Jones distributed a handout to the Committee Members. His goal is to create a cost effective local trash pickup service available to those who don't want to use the convenience center or can't afford the other options that are available. His option would also decrease the traffic at the convenience center, and would eliminate trash related inconveniences. He would help enforce that recycling is being done the correct way and would give \$3 back to the Township for every

paying customer. He is looking to have 100 residents sign up for his service. He asked for the Townships approval on his new business adventure. Mayor McKelvey stated that he liked his idea; however, there are things that would be out of the Township’s control. Such as, he would need a state license to pick up the trash, and then once he becomes a commercial hauler, the Township would have to pass an ordinance allowing him access to use the convenience center. Mr. Jones took questions from the public. Mayor McKelvey told him when he has everything needed to be a licensed hauler, to contact the Township Committee and they will revisit his idea.

Mayor McKelvey thanked Mr. Jones for his presentation.

PUBLIC SESSION

Mayor McKelvey asked for a motion to open public session and anyone wishing to speak, should stand, approach the microphone, state their name and where they reside, and briefly in five (5) minutes or less state your comments to the Township Committee.

On motion by Patrick, seconded by Morgan, public session was opened.

Mayor McKelvey seeing no one wishing to speak asked for a motion to close the public session.

Resolution No. 19-83, authorizing the refund of an overpayment and 2016 homestead rebate for a total disabled veteran pursuant to the direction of the Tax Collector, was adopted on motion by Patrick, seconded by Morgan.

RESOLUTION NO. 19-84 SETTING 2020 DOG LICENSING FEES

Resolution No. 19-84, setting 2020 Dog Licensing Fees as follows:

- \$17 Neutered/Spayed Dogs
- \$20 Non-neutered/Non-spayed Dogs
- \$25 Late Fee (effective February 16 each year)

was adopted on motion by Patrick, seconded by Morgan.

In regards to Resolution 19-84, Mayor McKelvey announced to the public that the dog license fees are increasing. He explained the cost to just be a member of the CCSPCA/SJRAS is extremely expensive. It is \$13,300.00 a year, and that doesn't include additional fees to the

On motion by Patrick, seconded by Morgan, the public hearing on Ordinance No. 519 was opened and the Clerk directed to read the ordinance by title on second reading. The Clerk read the ordinance by title. Mayor McKelvey announced that all interested parties would now be given opportunity to be heard on this ordinance.

There being no further questions or comments from the public, on motion by Patrick, seconded by Morgan, the public hearing was closed.

Morgan moved to adopt Ordinance No. 519 on second and final reading. Patrick seconded the motion.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Committeeman Morgan reported as follows:

- < Ag Advisory Board – Working on Preserving 4 farms (Rieck, Bell, Smith and R. Williams), recognizing NJCF (New Jersey Conservation Foundation) who provides private funding for preservation, with a letter of appreciation for the past 10 years they have preserved 482.9 acres in Alloway Twp.
- < Environmental Committee – working on their environmental resource inventory (ERI)
- < JIF – Annual retreat is coming up, a few representatives will be attending from Alloway

Deputy Mayor Patrick reported as follows:

- < Board of Recreation – Working on getting the parking lot regraded in the fall, the lake will be lowered in the fall, started replacing deck boards and cleaning up the dock area and a pet waste container will be installed
- < Public Works – grass on the sides of the streets is being mowed, getting issues at the sewer station under control, and the speed sign is up and running and hope it is being effective
