

The Regular Meeting of the Alloway Township Committee of the Township of Alloway, County of Salem was held at 7:00 p.m. in the Municipal/Senior Citizen Building in accordance with the Annual Notice adopted January 2, 2019, advertised in the South Jersey Times and the Elmer Times, posted in the Alloway Township Post Office and the Municipal Clerks Foyer in compliance with Public Law 1975, Chapter 231.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor P. Ed McKelvey, followed by the flag salute.

Reverend Jim Whitt of Ranch Hope opened the meeting in prayer.

PUBLIC SESSION

Mayor McKelvey asked for a motion to open public session and anyone wishing to speak, should stand, approach the microphone, state their name and where they reside, and briefly in five (5) minutes or less state your comments to the Township Committee.

On motion by Patrick, seconded by Morgan, public session was opened.

Vote: All in favor

Gregory Quinlan, The Center for Garden State Families (Christian Family Advocate Organization) located in New Jersey. He offered information to the Committee and public regarding surveys done about homosexuality. He stated he is a former homosexual and represents hundreds of thousands of people who left homosexuality. He stated he found out that the sciences and findings indicated that no one is born gay. He quoted the American Psychiatric Association, "there are no replicated scientific studies supporting any specific biological etiology for homosexuality." He stated that the results of a 13 year project with the National Institute of Health called The Human Genome Project (1990-2003), which costed multi-millions of dollars, found nothing that supported the gay gene. He also shared results from a recent survey study by Harvard and MIT, which was done by and run by those who identify as LGBT. This survey determined that the fact is and that science shows that homosexuality is a developmental gender identity disorder; developed, not inapt, acquired, not in born. He concluded by urging everyone to understand that the LGBT Education Law is politically and scientifically wrong and is a violation of the first amendment. He said it is already law and parents cannot opt-out. It will require civil disobedience and we need to encourage parents to take their children out of those classes to protect their children because this will harm them.

Amy Smith, 87 Commissioners Pike-concerned community member, friend and ally of many LGBT folks. She suggested more residents and businesses are needed for the town to thrive. She would like to go on record and ask the Committee to put forward a work plan showing what they plan to do to revitalize Alloway. She would also like on record that the Township creates an Ethics Committee, as well as, receive trainings regarding discrimination, harassment, and violations of constitutional rights in compliance with Resolution 18-68. She stated the Trevor Project's National Survey on LGBTQ youth mental health, over 34,000 respondents ages 13-24 across the US, showed there's a mental health epidemic among LGBTQ youth with politics playing a huge role from the White House, State Houses to local levels. Survey results of suicidal respondents: 76% - politics impacted their mental health; 30% - young Trans people had committed suicide; 54% - had attempted suicide.

Al Parker, Pennsville, NJ, shared that he had a troubled childhood, but was able to change his life. In regards to the suicide rates, he stated it's not a natural desire to want to commit suicide and if 30% of LGBTQ want to commit suicide then this problem needs to be looked into. He added that kids don't need to be taught about LGBT in school.

Lori Wagner, 44 West Main Street, Alloway, suggested a dog park in the Township behind the firehouse where the old baseball fields use to be. She also suggested that dog waste stations be placed around town. Deputy Mayor Patrick stated the Committee would discuss the ideas.

Laurie McGuire, Yorketown Road, Alloway, questioned section 7 and 8 of Resolution 18-68. Mayor McKelvey responded that the Township has never had any employees or volunteers make a complaint regarding Civil Rights Violations. For the record, she requested that the Township create an Ethics Committee. Additionally, she would like to see communication between the residents and the Township Committee improves by having email addresses for the Committee members.

Mayor McKelvey asked if there was anyone else from the public that would like to speak. Seeing no one wishing to speak Mayor McKelvey asked for a motion to close the public session. On motion by Patrick, seconded by Morgan, public session was closed. Vote: All in favor

There were 84 questions and the Township scored high enough to receive 100% in State Aid, which is normal for Alloway Township.

He said anyone can feel free to stop by or call him. He added that all 3 of the Committeemen are approachable.

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE MAYOR AND COMMITTEE OF THE TOWNSHIP  
OF ALLOWAY, COUNTY OF SALEM, STATE OF NEW JERSEY,  
REPEALING ORDINANCE 511 AUTHORIZING THE INSTALLATION OF  
A ONE-WAY SIGN ON CEDAR STREET FROM THE CORNER OF  
SCHOOL LANE TO WATERWORKS ROAD**

**WHEREAS**, by Ordinance 511, the Township Committee of the Township of Alloway authorized the installation of a one-way sign on Cedar Street from the corner of School Lane to Waterworks Road on December 20, 2018; and

**WHEREAS**, at a regular finance meeting held on January 17, 2019, Chloe Williams of B.R. Williams, Inc., the bus company that provides school transportation for Alloway residents, appeared before the Township Committee and expressed her concerns regarding the installation of the one-way sign. Specifically, Ms. Williams indicated that the current delivery and pickup conditions at the Alloway Township School is one of the best in the area, and altering these conditions may lead to other safety concerns; and

**WHEREAS**, based on the information provided by Ms. Williams, the governing body believes that it is in the best interest of the residents of the Township of Alloway to repeal Ordinance 511.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED**, by the Mayor and Committee of the Township of Alloway, in the County of Salem and State of New Jersey, and it is hereby enacted and ordained by the authority of same that Ordinance 511 is repealed in its entirety.

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 87  
ENTITLED "PEDDLING AND SOLICITING"**

**WHEREAS**, the Township Committee of the Township of Alloway desires to amend Chapter 87. Entitled "Peddling and Soliciting".

**BE IT ORDAINED** by the Township Committee of the Township of Alloway in the County of Salem and State of New Jersey that the language in Chapter 87 §87-4 A. (9) be amended as follows:

**§ 87-4. License application.**

**A. (9)** A copy of the vendor's current health inspection.

**BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED** by the Township Committee of the Township of Alloway in the County of Salem and State of New Jersey, that § 87-9 (E) include an additional prohibited item as follows:

**§ 87-9. General regulations.**

**E.** The Township may, from year to year, prohibit by resolution the sale of certain items such as, but not limited to, silly string, cap guns and caps, stink bombs, poppers, smoke bombs, light lasers and political items. The prohibited sale item list is attached to the application and license.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED** by the Mayor and Governing Body of the municipality of Alloway Township in the County of Salem and State of New Jersey, that the above changes be made.

If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held by any Court of competent jurisdiction to be unconstitutional or invalid, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

All Ordinances or parts which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Amendment to an Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon posting, publication and final passage in the manner prescribed by law.
