

## ALLOWAY TOWNSHIP FINANCE COMMITTEE

May 18, 2020

Due to the current situation of the Coronavirus Pandemic (COVID-19), this meeting was held telephonically.

At 5:00 p.m. the Regular Meeting of the Alloway Township Finance Committee was called to order by P. Ed McKelvey, Mayor. The meeting was advertised in the South Jersey Times and the Elmer Times in accordance with Public Law 1975, Chapter 231.

Roll Call - Present: Morgan, Patrick, McKelvey  
Municipal Clerk/Administrator, Charlet Cheeseman and CFO/Treasurer, Marie Stout was also in attendance.

### PUBLIC SESSION

On motion by Patrick, seconded by Morgan, the public session was opened and Mayor McKelvey called for any questions or comments from the public.

Vote: All in favor

Jim Whitt, Alloway, asked if the Public Memorial Day Ceremony was going to be cancelled since the County cancelled their ceremony. Mayor McKelvey responded it is cancelled.

Mayor McKelvey asked if there were any other public comments. There being no further comments from the public, a motion was made by Patrick and seconded by Morgan to close Public Session.

Vote: All in favor

Mayor McKelvey asked if each committee member had sufficient time to review the bill list. Each member stated they did. CFO/Treasurer Stout asked for approval to add Invoices from Petroni & Associates to the bill list. The Committee was in agreement to add to May's bill list. Mayor McKelvey reviewed the finance items placed on the upcoming meeting agenda. Discussion ensued and Mayor McKelvey instructed Clerk Cheeseman to add the items pertaining to the Parave Farm and Bell and Rieck Farms to the upcoming agenda. Mayor McKelvey asked if anyone had any comments and Deputy Mayor Patrick stated that the Capital Ordinance is on the agenda to prepare for the oil and stone project when the committee is in agreement to proceed. Committeeman Morgan asked for clarification of roads. Deputy Mayor Patrick stated it would be Brickyard and Earnest Garton Roads as the base bid and Swedes Bridge and Roberts as Alternates. The Township Committee was in agreement with the selection.

Committeeman Morgan stated he has received complaints regarding Alloway-Friesburg Road. The Mayor stated he would contact the County Engineer to get update on this road, as well as, Alloway-Aldine Road.

Regarding the correspondence from NJ Conservation Foundation requesting whether or not Alloway will want a future right of way plotted for Cobbs Mill and/or Ernest Garton Road, the Committee members stated they need more time to review the maps that were provided.

At this time the discussion ensued regarding the FY 2021 Municipal Aid Program and it was the consensus of the Committee to apply for the grant for Pierson Road-Section III. Clerk Cheeseman will initiate the application and contact Fralinger Engineering to proceed with the paperwork.

There were no questions regarding the agenda items.  
The Committee members had no revisions for April's meeting minutes.

Mayor McKelvey asked for an update on the speed signs and no parking anytime signs on Neil Court. Deputy Mayor Patrick stated the PWM was calling to get mark outs for where the signs would be placed.

Mayor McKelvey asked the Committeemen if they had anything else to add and Committeeman Morgan and Deputy Mayor Patrick responded no.

There being no further business to come before the Committee, on motion by Patrick, seconded by Morgan, the meeting was adjourned at 5:17 p.m.
