ALLOWAY TOWNSHIP BOARD OF HEALTH - REORGANIZATION

MARCH 19, 2020

On motion by Patrick, seconded Morgan, the regular meeting of the Township Committee was recessed and the 2020 Reorganization Meeting of the Board of Health was opened.

Statement was made that adequate notice of the 2020 Reorganization Meeting of the Board of Health was provided by the Municipal Clerk on March 5, 2020 with notice being posted on the bulletin board in the Alloway Post Office and sent electronically to the South Jersey Times and the Elmer Times.

On motion by Patrick, seconded by Morgan, the minutes of the last quarterly meeting held on December 19, 2019 were approved as submitted.

PUBLIC SESSION

On motion by Patrick, seconded by Morgan, the public session was opened.

Robert Dickinson, County Health Officer, was happy to attend the meeting and to see everyone practicing social distancing. He said it's very important to wash our hands and to look after our Seniors. According to the CDC 45% of the Seniors who get sick are hospitalized and 53% of those are admitted to an ICU unit. As of today, New Jersey has 9 deaths and 742 positive cases. Cases range from ages 3 to 95 which shows that younger people can also get the virus. Salem and Cumberland Counties have no reported cases as yet. He suggested reaching out to your neighbors to check in on them and to work together to get through this. Deputy Mayor Patrick asked what the stats were for people who have recovered from the virus, Mr. Dickinson said there have been many more people who recovered than died. He also stated that we don't really know how many cases are actually out there because people with mild cases are not being reported.

There being no other questions or comments from the public, on motion by Patrick, seconded by Morgan, the public session was closed.

Jim Whitt, Alloway, asked if the Public Memorial Day Ceremony was going to be cancelled since the County cancelled their ceremony. Mayor McKelvey responded it is cancelled.

The Township Committee was in agreement with the selection.

Committeeman Morgan stated he has received complaints regarding Alloway-Friesburg Road. The Mayor stated he would contact the County Engineer to get update on this road, as well as, Alloway-Aldine Road.

Regarding the correspondence from NJ Conservation Foundation requesting whether or not Alloway will want a future right of way plotted for Cobbs Mill and/or Ernest Garton Road, the Committee members stated they need more time to review the maps that were provided.

At this time the discussion ensued regarding the FY 2021 Municipal Aid Program and it was the consensus of the Committee to apply for the grant for Pierson Road-Section III. Clerk Cheeseman will initiate the application and contact Fralinger Engineering to proceed with the paperwork.

There were no questions regarding the agenda items.

The Committee members had no revisions for April's meeting minutes.

Mayor McKelvey asked for an update on the speed signs and no parking anytime signs on Neil Court. Deputy Mayor Patrick stated the PWM was calling to get mark outs for where the signs would be placed.

Mayor McKelvey asked the Committeemen if they had anything else to add and Committeeman Morgan and Deputy Mayor Patrick responded no.

He also stated that he has been asked when would people be getting back out on the roads to clean them up through the Clean Communities Program. Mayor McKelvey said Cathy DeHart, Clean Communities Coordinator has been working to get the program back up and running.

MAYOR'S REPORT

Mayor McKelvey expressed how important that the need for S.C.I.A. (County Landfill) to reopen. Closing it put a hardship on many Townships in the County. More trash has been generated with residents being home and doing cleanouts that our Convenience Center has seen a big increase in trash disposal than normal. He also had a conference call with Senator Booker, Freeholders and other Mayors from the County and acknowledged Senator Booker has been working hard to get money for New Jersey and smaller Communities. He spoke with Senator Van Drew's office and he was very supportive in getting businesses back opened in South Jersey. He contacted the Salem County Engineer's Office regarding Friesburg Rd, and was told it's on the docket to be redone in 2021, Also County Road 611 from E. Main Street to Remsterville Road is to be done later in 2020. He was informed by the Tax Collector that the Township is way behind in Tax Collecting for the year and need to be cautious on how we spend money.

**A RESOLUTION URGING GOVERNOR PHIL MURPHY TO RE-OPEN
THE COUNTY OF SALEM**

WHEREFORE, pursuant to several Executive Orders, Governor Phil Murphy has essentially shut down all business operations and recreational activities in the County of Salem and the Township of Alloway due to the COVID-19 virus, leaving the County of Salem completely frozen economically since March 9, 2020; and

WHEREFORE, Governor Murphy's Orders are oppressive and place undue restrictions on the Constitutional rights afforded to all residents of the County of Salem and the Township of Alloway such as the inherent rights of freedom of religion, freedom to assemble, and the freedom to enjoy life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness; and

WHEREFORE, Salem County, including the Township of Alloway, is uniquely vulnerable economically in that it consists of mainly small businesses and farms and thus the working families of our County and Township are in dire need of immediate re-opening of our businesses to support our economic well-being; too many of our residents remain out of work and are struggling to support themselves and their families during this time; and

WHEREFORE, the COVID-19 pandemic has also created a backlog in the State unemployment system, preventing our residents from filing for benefits and also from receiving their money, which has also created an undue hardship on the financial stability on the residents of the County of Salem, including residents of the Township of Alloway; and

WHEREFORE, this situation not only impacts the County and Township financially, but it also has an adverse impact on the mental and emotional well-being on our citizens; and

WHEREFORE, the implementation of said orders have different impacts on areas throughout the State of New Jersey and should not be enforced in a uniform manner throughout the State; For example, the County of Salem, including the Township of Alloway, is entirely unique to the northern regions of the State and therefore should not be confined to the same rules and restrictions that have been placed on more populous regions; and

WHEREFORE, current statistics suggest that Salem County has suffered a mild outbreak of the COVID-19 virus and a downward trend is underway. The County's total positive cases represent just .06% of Salem County's population; and

WHEREFORE, While the Governor has established a Task Force to assist in the re-opening of the State of New Jersey, it does not represent the interests of the County of Salem or the Township of Alloway. There is no representation for small business or agriculture on the panel and these areas of business represent most of Salem County and the Township of Alloway; thus the citizens of the County of Salem and the Township of Alloway are demanding their voices be heard and interests defended at the State level; and

WHEREFORE, on May 18, 2020, Governor Murphy unveiled a multi-stage approach to execute a responsible and strategic restart of New Jersey's Economy, consisting of a three-stage process, guided by plans for a methodical and strategic reopening of businesses and activities based on level of disease transmission risk and essential classification; and

WHEREFORE, President Trump's "Opening Up America Again" guidance suggests that State and local officials need to tailor re-opening plans to local circumstances (e.g. rural and suburban areas where outbreaks have not occurred or have been mild should be re-opened more quickly than more metropolitan areas); and

WHEREFORE, the Governor of the State of New Jersey should heed the federal recommendations and guidance and allow for the immediate reopening of areas of mild outbreak, such as the County of Salem, including the Township of Alloway, so as to encourage economic activity so desperately needed throughout our State and to allow citizens to restore a semblance of normality; and

WHEREFORE, other States, such as Delaware and Rhode Island, are more similar to the socio-economic structure of the County of Salem and the Township of Alloway and have already successfully implemented re-opening plans and therefore that precedent should be followed more closely for our region; and

WHEREFORE, consensus has been built by and between our business community and our Municipal and County governments to accept this reality and work with the State and its administration on a reopening that invests in the safety of the community and the dampening of spread of the virus; and

WHEREFORE, in furtherance thereof, Salem County Board of Chosen Freeholders has established a task force to assist with the re-opening of public facilities and businesses within the County, which has determined that now is the time to open the County of Salem and will assist the County in developing economic recovery strategies to assist our businesses in furtherance thereof; and

WHEREFORE, while the Township of Pilesgrove does not condone civil disobedience, it does recognize and acknowledge the frustration of its residents to the oppressive nature and unconstitutionality of the restrictions placed upon them by the Governor of the State of New Jersey; and

WHEREFORE, the County of Salem previously passed Resolution 2020-165 urging the Governor of the State of New Jersey to permit ALL businesses to re-open immediately, subject to mitigation protocols to provide for the safety and wellness of its residents or in the alternative to all the County of Salem or in the alternative to allow the County of Salem to immediately open pursuant to Stage 3 as per the May 18, 2020 implementation plan as referenced herein; and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Township Committee of the Township of Alloway hereby urges that Governor Phil Murphy immediately permit the County of Salem, including the Township of Alloway, to open ALL businesses and recreational activities to the public at this time, subject to mitigation protocols to provide for the safety and wellness of its residents, or in the alternative to allow the County of Salem and the Township of Alloway to immediately open pursuant to Stage 3 as per the May 18, 2020 implementation plan as referenced herein.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this resolution be forwarded to New Jersey Governor Phil Murphy, Senate President Stephen M. Sweeney and the municipalities within Salem County.
