

The Regular Meeting of the Alloway Township Committee of the Township of Alloway, County of Salem was held at 7:00 p.m. in the Municipal/Senior Citizen Building in accordance with the Annual Notice adopted January 2, 2020, advertised in the South Jersey Times and the Elmer Times, posted in the Alloway Township Post Office and the Municipal Clerks Foyer in compliance with Public Law 1975, Chapter 231.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor P. Ed McKelvey, followed by the flag salute.

Reverend Jim Whitt of Ranch Hope opened the meeting in prayer.

Mayor McKelvey asked for a motion to open public session and anyone wishing to speak, should stand, approach the microphone, state their name and where they reside, and briefly in three (3) minutes or less state your comments to the Township Committee.

Warren Wieting, 36 Cobbs Mill Road, Alloway stated he noticed there wasn't a lot of paper being recycled at the Convenience Center and asked if the State had changed the way paper was being recycled. Mayor McKelvey said when in doubt, throw it out in your regular trash. He also reminded residents that greasy pizza boxes and plastic bags do not get recycled.

Amy Smith, Commissioner Pike, Alloway made a request for the Township Committee to establish an Ethics Committee as well as attend trainings. She remarked on Gregory Quinlan's comments regarding the homosexual scientific survey results Mr. Quinlan offered to the Committee and public during November's Township Committee meeting. She believed that it is important for young people to learn about LGBTQ people in history along with learning about heterosexual people in history.

Laurie McGuire, Yorketown Road, Alloway responded to comments Mayor McKelvey stated at the last Township Committee meeting i.e. importance of truth and kindness. She requested that the Township Officials create email addresses and an Ethics Committee for the Township.

Margaret Matthews, 22 Stockington Road, Alloway stated she supports all LGBTQ people. She noticed that the speed sign hasn't been moved to Greenwich Street.

Brian Leady, Remsterville Road, Alloway stated he's been a resident of Alloway Township since 1968 and has known most of the councilmen for many years. He has been on the Ambulance Squad for 10 years and treats all patients equally. He applauds Mayor McKelvey for taking a stand regarding LBGTQ being taught in the schools. He believed Mayor McKelvey is an ethical person and shared he will always support Mayor McKelvey.

Mayor McKelvey asked if there was anyone else from the public that would like to speak. Seeing no one wishing to speak Mayor McKelvey asked for a motion to close the public session. On motion by Patrick, seconded by Morgan, public session was closed.
