2. Revise Stormwater Control Ordinance: Discussion ensued. Committee members need to review the materials further from the Planning Board and Clerk Cheeseman was instructed to place on the upcoming meeting agenda for discussion.
3. Format of the upcoming meeting: After discussion, the Township Committee agreed it would be held in-person adhering to the Covid-19 compliance protocols. The Mayor stated, he wants the public to contact the Clerk's office ahead of time to make reservations.

Deputy Mayor Patrick asked if anyone had an update on their previous discussions regarding the Ambulance Squad's future plans. Committeeman Morgan, Ambulance Corp. Commissioner, stated he would attend an upcoming Ambulance meeting and relay the Committees concerns.
