

At 5:00 p.m. the Regular Meeting of the Alloway Township Finance Committee was called to order by P. Ed McKelvey, Mayor. The meeting was advertised in the South Jersey Times and the Elmer Times in accordance with Public Law 1975, Chapter 231. Pursuant to the State of New Jersey COVID-19 Compliance Protocol, the meeting was held in-person with limited seating in the meeting room at the Municipal Building.

The flag salute was led by Mayor McKelvey.

Roll Call - Present: Morgan, Patrick, McKelvey  
Municipal Clerk/Administrator, Charlet Cheeseman CMFO/QPA, Bette Jo Pigliacelli and Treasurer, Lois Yarrington were also in attendance.

### PUBLIC SESSION

There being no one in the audience, a motion was made by Patrick and seconded by Morgan to close Public Session.

Vote: All in favor

The Township Committee members reviewed the bill list and with no one having any questions, the approval sheet for the Bill List was signed.

The following was discussed:

- 2021 Oil & Stone Program: The CPWM provided an updated list of roads. The Committee agreed to look at the roads to see which ones are priority.

- CFO Pigliacelli reviewed the finance related resolutions and ordinances on the upcoming agenda. She informed the Committee that an amended budget resolution is required before adopting the 2021 Budget, as the Township received revenue from the recycling tonnage grant. No one had any questions.

The Committee members had no revisions for March's meeting minutes.

### DISCUSSION/CORRESPONDENCE:

1. Cobbs Mill Estates HOA: Request for 2 street lights on Kristine Court. Discussion ensued and the Committee agreed to go to Kristine Court to see where the stubs are located.
2. Marijuana/Cannabis: Per Twp. Solicitor, previously drafted Ordinance to prohibit all classes and types of Cannabis-related, medical cannabis-related and other marijuana-related land uses within Alloway Township was provided to the Planning Board Chair for the Planning Board to review.
3. JIF "Protecting Children" Policy: Discussion ensued and the Committee has questions.
4. Resident at 25 Holly Trail concern regarding ponding water. Mayor McKelvey and CPWM Micklasavage visited the location and have been in contact with the resident.
5. Fire Company request to hold a car show event in June in the Municipal parking lot area with possibly having a food vendor. The Committee approved as long as the paperwork was in order. Clerk Cheeseman will forward food vendor information from the DOH to President of Fire Company.
6. Girl Scout Headquarters requesting a Congratulatory Letter/Certificate from the Committee to an Alloway Girl Scout for earning the Girl Scout Gold Award. Discussion ensued and Mayor McKelvey instructed Clerk Cheeseman to prepare a Certificate for their ceremony in May.
7. Halloween Parade Committee requesting to hold parade activities and closure of Township and County Roads on October 30 with a rain date on October 31. The Committee authorized as long as the County Commissioners approve and paperwork is in order.

8. Request from resident at 41 E. Main Street regarding credit of sewage bills. Clerk Cheeseman provided Committee with emails from the Code Official, Tax/Sewer Collector and Tax Assessor. Code Official approved home as a single-family home, therefore, Committee approved the credit. Mayor McKelvey instructed Clerk Cheeseman to place on upcoming agenda for consideration.

Committeeman Morgan shared he was asked if a “Dangerous Curve” or “Curve Ahead” sign could be installed on County Road 611 near Glasshouse and Remsterville Roads where the curve is located. Discussion ensued. Clerk Cheeseman will contact the County Engineers Department with the request. This topic led to a discussion about when the line stripping on Friesburg-Aldine Road and on Telegraph Road will be done, as the County approved these 2 road requests in late 2019 and early 2020. Clerk Cheeseman will include this with the sign request.

Clerk Cheeseman informed the Committee she was contacted by the new Principal of Alloway School, Pamela Southard. Ms. Southard and Steven Crispin, Superintendent met with her on April 8, 2021 to tour the Municipal Building, since she is new. She wanted to familiarize herself with the layout in the event of a school evacuation/relocation. She said they are working on a detailed plan and will share it with Clerk Cheeseman once the School Safety Team reviews it.

Deputy Mayor Patrick was recently notified about a confrontation at the Convenience Center between the attendant and a resident.

There being no further business to come before the Committee, on motion by Patrick, seconded by Morgan, the meeting was adjourned at 6:15 p.m.
