

The Regular Meeting of the Alloway Township Committee of the Township of Alloway, County of Salem was held at 7:00 p.m. by noticing the South Jersey Times and the Elmer Times and posting on the Township Website, Post Office and Municipal Building Doors in compliance with Public Law 1975, Chapter 231. In accordance with the State of New Jersey COVID-19 Compliance Protocol, the meeting was held in-person with limited seating in the auditorium at the Municipal Building.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor P. Ed McKelvey, followed by the flag salute.

Reverend Dave Bailey, Sr., Founder of Ranch Hope Inc., opened the meeting in prayer.

Mayor McKelvey asked for a motion to open public session and anyone wishing to speak, state their name and where they reside, and briefly in three (3) minutes or less state your comments to the Township Committee.

On motion by Patrick, seconded by Morgan, public session was opened.

The following residents spoke at their seats.

Carol Roberts, Alloway resident, attended the meeting and asked the Mayor if he met with Dave Bailey, Jr. to attend a meeting about an incident and if she can be included. The Mayor responded that he has spoken with him twice since the last meeting. Dave Bailey, Jr. agreed to meet with the Committee privately next week. The Mayor will see if Ms. Roberts can attend the meeting as well. He said Dave Bailey, Jr. also wants to have an open house for the towns people and he would be more than willing to give tours of Ranch Hope. They want the community to be more involved and know what's going on.

Joe Quather, E. Main Street, questioned the representation for Alloway at the upcoming Salem County Improvement Authority (S.C.I.A.) meeting regarding the Giordano Trash Project and the major impact the trucks will have on the community. Mayor McKelvey, Liaison for Alloway Township for the Solid Waste Advisory Committee (S.W.A.C) expressed that the Township

Committee has not discussed the issue as a Committee, but asked each Committee member to share their individual thoughts. Committeeman Morgan stated he is one hundred percent against it and the entire community would be affected. He said he is planning to attend the (S.W.A.C.) meeting. Deputy Patrick stated he is also against it. Discussion ensued about the possible issues this could bring the community. Mayor McKelvey stated his concerns and that he is not interested in the revenue. He also stated the importance of attending the meeting on April 19th, 2021 at S.C.I.A. so everyone's voices can be heard. Committeeman Morgan stated that the Environmental Committee submitted a letter to let them know their views on the landfill and this possible trash project.

Sina Kurman, Alloway resident, asked if the Township could put a notice about the S.C.I.A. meeting at the Post Office so people can get the information. Discussion ensued about the information getting out to the town. Mayor McKelvey stated individuals have been going door to door.

Richard Caldwell, 461 Alloway Friesburg Road, came to discuss his neighbor's property. Mr. Caldwell stated that within the last 3 weeks, there is a mass of animals. There are dogs barking ridiculously, and he is concerned for the animal's conditions. He stated the barking dogs and the roosters are the main issue. He has spoken with the owners and the Animal Control Officer. He asked if there is anything the Township can do about the issues. He thanked the Township Committee for their time. Discussion continued about the property and concerns. Committeeman Morgan stated that the email received by the Township from that property owner was threatening and they will need to look into what can be done working with the Animal Control Officer and State Police.

Dusty Meyers, Alloway, stated he just received a letter about the property across the road from him at 37 Brickyard pertaining to an active clay mine and expressed his concern for the possibility of the trucks coming down his road. Committeeman Morgan (Liaison for the Planning Board) stated that Mr. Massari and his son attended last night's Planning Board meeting as they were seeking a final site plan—extension renewal. He shared it is an existing clay mine and is already permitted to do that and a renewal extension is being applied for now, as that is done every five (5) years whether they are taking the dirt out or not. Committeeman Morgan also stated he has not heard about it becoming active. Discussion ensued about the renewal process and the letter that was received.

Mayor McKelvey asked if there was anyone else from the public that would like to speak. No one responded, therefore, Mayor McKelvey asked for a motion to close the public session.

On motion by Patrick, seconded by Morgan, public session was closed.

**AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING THE SUM OF \$310,000 FROM THE CAPITAL
IMPROVEMENT FUND FOR VARIOUS IMPROVEMENTS BY THE TOWNSHIP OF
ALLOWAY, COUNTY OF SALEM, STATE OF NEW JERSEY**

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF
ALLOWAY, IN THE COUNTY OF SALEM, STATE OF NEW JERSEY AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. \$310,000.00 is hereby appropriated from the Capital Improvement Fund for
acquisitions by the Township of Alloway, in the County of Salem, State of New Jersey:

<u>Purpose</u>	<u>Appropriation</u>
1. Improvements to Various Roads throughout the Township. Included but not limited to Earnest Garton Rd, Brickyard Rd, Dorrell Ln, and Pierson Rd.	\$265,000.00
2. Repair of Municipal Building and Fire House Roof	\$ 45,000.00

SECTION 2: In connection with the amounts authorized in Section 1, the Township makes
the following determination:

- a) The purpose described in Section 1 is not a Current Expense and is an
improvement, which the Township may lawfully make as a general
improvement.
- b) The period of usefulness of the purpose described in Section 1 hereof is within
the limitations of the Local Bond Law and according to the reasonable life
thereof is five (5) years or more.
- c) No debt is authorized by this ordinance.
- d) The Capital budget is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this
ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency therewith, and the resolution
promulgated by the Local Finance board showing full detail of the amended
capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director of the Division
of Local Government Services, is on file with the Township Clerk and available
for inspection.

SECTION 3: All ordinances or parts of ordinances that are inconsistent with the terms of
this ordinance be and the same are hereby repealed to the extent of their inconsistency.

SECTION 4: This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon proper passage,
publication in accordance with law and after final adoption as provided by law.
