

At 5:02 p.m. the Regular Meeting of the Alloway Township Finance Committee was called to order by P. Ed McKelvey, Mayor. The meeting was advertised in the designated newspapers in accordance with Public Law 1975, Chapter 231.

The flag salute was led by Mayor McKelvey.

Roll Call - Present: Morgan, Patrick, McKelvey

Absent: Municipal Clerk Cheeseman

Also in attendance was CFO, Bette Jo Pigliacelli who took notes of the meeting

On motion by Patrick, seconded by Morgan, the public session was opened and Mayor McKelvey called for any questions or comments from the public.

Vote: All in favor

John Mahala, Alloway Twp. Fire Chief informed the Committee of the following:

-Filed public health form to Tabatha...waiting for her response

-Ladder truck—problem with back end (springs)... reaching out to a company in Vineland or Trenton and will let the Committee know the cost

-LAC National Night Out (8/2/22) Ladder truck will be hanging flag—responding, if necessary, from LAC that night

-Want to apply for a Fire Grant through the American Rescue Act up to \$75,000 to be used for turnout gear or safety gear. A Resolution is needed to be adopted by the governing body... will send a sample to Clerk Charlet for the 8/18 meeting agenda. Also, will need the Township to upfront the money since it is a reimbursable grant

There being no further comments from the public, a motion was made by Patrick and seconded by Morgan to close Public Session.

Vote: All in favor

The Township Committee members reviewed the bill list and with no one having any questions, the approval sheet for the Bill List was signed.

Vote: All in favor

CMFO Pigliacelli requested to get a quote for video surveillance for the Municipal Building and the Governing Body authorized she go out for solicitation of cameras.

The following was discussed:

1. Kristine Court: Electric charge for new street light
2. Sewer Operator: The Committee agreed to appoint CMR Environmental Services LLC and the Operator toured and met with the DPW crew
3. Ordinance Review for Chapter 42-5 (12) Alloway Lake Rules and Regulations: Committee stated that only law enforcement can issued citations and agreed to amend section and place on upcoming agenda
4. NJDEP Bureau of NJPDES Stormwater Permitting & Water Quality Management: Notification of reassignment from a Tier B to a Tier A: Discussion ensued. This will put a lot more work on Township along with additional costs in order to comply. Mayor McKelvey is not in favor and will have Clerk Cheeseman look into the Appeal process.
5. Signs and rumble strips on Watsons Mill Road on or about August 1, 2022.

The Committee members had no revisions for June's meeting minutes. The Committee reviewed the upcoming items on the agenda and supported adding Resolution 22-80 & 22-81 to the upcoming meeting agenda.

Mayor McKelvey shared he contacted the Board of Election Commissioners and requested they remove the Ballot Box from Alloway's grounds. He said Commissioner Mulligan did not state opposition to the request.

Deputy Mayor Patrick, Liaison for the Board of Recreation Commissioners, suggested dissolving B.R.C. as of 12/31/2022, as they are unable to get members and the items for the lake are in the process of being completed.

Committeeman Morgan, Liaison for the Agriculture Advisory Board, shared there was an issue with State in preserving the Rieck farm and the S.A.D.C. is correcting the language.

There being no further business to come before the Committee, on motion by Patrick, seconded by Morgan, the meeting was adjourned at 5:55p.m.
