**ALLOWAY TOWNSHIP
ORDINANCE NO. 546**

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE MAYOR AND COMMITTEE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF
ALLOWAY, COUNTY OF SALEM, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AMENDING
CHAPTER 42, SECTION 5 OF THE CODE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF ALLOWAY
ENTITLED "ALLOWAY LAKE RULES AND REGULATIONS"**

WHEREAS, the Township of Alloway desires to protect the safety and well-being of all residents of the Township of Alloway; and

WHEREAS, due to increased criminal activity and violations of the current rules and regulations in place, the Gloucester, Salem, Cumberland Counties Municipal Joint Insurance Fund which ensures all claims for the Township of Alloway has recommended certain changes to the current rules and regulations; and

WHEREAS, the Township Committee and Township Solicitor have reviewed these changes, along with consultation with the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (NJDEP) and agree that such changes should be incorporated;

WHEREAS, it is in the public interest for the Township of Alloway to amend the Alloway Lake Rules and Regulations to prohibit swimming; and

WHEREAS, upon passage, all duly noticed public hearings, as required by law will have been held by the Township, at which all residents and interested persons were given an opportunity to be heard.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Committee of the Township of Alloway, in the County of Salem and State of New Jersey, and it is hereby enacted and ordained by the authority:

Chapter 42, Section 5, C. Swimming is hereby amended as follows:

SWIMMING. Swimming is expressly prohibited at all times, regardless of hours of operation and without exception. Any violations of this section shall be prosecuted in the Pilesgrove Joint Municipal Court pursuant to Section 8 of this Chapter.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED THAT this Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage and publication in accordance with law.
