- < Public Works: the oil & stone project was completed; continue to mow roads. He said if there's something that is a safety issue and needs to be addressed to contact Public Works Dept.
- < Board of Recreation Commissioners: talked about the Algal Bloom at the lake and security at the lake access.

MAYOR'S REPORT

Mayor McKelvey attended the South Jersey Transportation meeting. He shared that he was informed by the County Board of Commissioners that they reversed their decision to install 4-way stop signs at Commissioners Pike-Watsons Mill and Alloway-Aldine & Watsons Mill Road intersections. He was told that the County will instead install "flashing" stop signs. He expressed his disappointment to County Commissioner Ben Laury. He added that the Township Committee is still pushing for 4-way stop signs in center of town. He was told that the traffic studies were done.
