- < Environmental Commission: The Commission remains concerned about situation at Paradise Lake and hopes the DEP resolves it.
- < Agricultural Board: The offer on the Farrow and Horner Farms were a lot lower than other offers. He spoke to S.A.D.C. regarding these offers.

Deputy Mayor Patrick reported as follows:

- < B.R.C: Discussed proposal for the electrical gate at the lake access and plan to get a couple more quotes. County Health Specialist Emily Simons gave him an update on the algal bloom and said it is not actually algal, it is a bacterium that is always there, but the good algal died because of the heat and the bad bacteria took over. A really good freeze would help.
- < Steering Committee: Veterans Day Ceremony Nov. 11<sup>th</sup> at 11 a.m.; Discussed Christmas Tree Lighting Ceremony and prizes for the competition.

MAYOR’S REPORT

Mayor McKelvey shared that the Township Committee members and several residents attended the County Commissioners meeting and spoke regarding the 4-way stop signs in the center of town. He also commented on the matter at Paradise Lake and hopes it will be resolved soon.
