The Regular Meeting of the Alloway Township Committee met in the Auditorium of the Municipal Building on September 21, 2023 at 7:00 p.m. Mayor P. Ed McKelvey presided. Mayor McKelvey called the meeting to order and stated that the meeting was transmitted to the Township designated newspapers in accordance with Public Law 1975, Chapter 231. He led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Reverend Jim Whitt, United Methodist Church of Alloway, opened the meeting in prayer.

Roll Call - Present: Leady, Morgan, McKelvey

Municipal Clerk, Charlet Cheeseman was also in attendance.

At 7:01 p.m. On motion by Leady, seconded by Morgan, the regular meeting of the Township Committee was recessed and the regular quarterly Board of Health meeting was opened. Vote: All in favor

At 7:03 p.m. On motion by Leady, seconded by Morgan, the regular quarterly Board of Health meeting was adjourned and the regular meeting of the Township Committee was reopened. Vote: All in favor

#### **MINUTES**

Minutes of the following meetings were reviewed by the Committee. Motion was made by Leady, seconded by Morgan, to dispense with the reading of and approve the minutes.

#### BILLS

## PUBLIC SESSION

Mayor McKelvey asked for a motion to open public session and anyone wishing to speak, state their name and where they reside, and briefly in three (3) minutes or less state your comments to the Township Committee.

On motion by Leady seconded by Morgan, public session was opened. Vote: All in favor

Mr. Whitt shared the senior luncheon was this afternoon and had approximately 40 people in attendance. The topic for the speaker was 911 and next month the topic will pertain to Medicare. He added it will be held on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Thursday of each month from 12 noon to 2:00 p.m. He thanked the Committee for use of the community room.

Joe Quather asked the Committee the following: 1. Status of the renewal of the Host Community Benefits between the Township and S.C.I.A.: Mayor McKelvey stated the Township and S.C.I.A. are still in negotiations. He told the public their new offer includes a roll off truck and the new benefit amount of \$2.85 is very competitive with surrounding areas. However, the negotiations will continue until the Committee is satisfied and believe they received the best deal possible for the Township. 2. Mr. Quather shared Harrisonville Fire Company in South Harrison receives a yearly donation of \$25,000. 3. Mr. Quather questioned why the income for the clean community grant monies and the NJDOT grant monies were not listed in the 2023 budget. Committeeman Morgan stated the Township applies every year to NJDOT for road improvements. Right now, Pierson Road Section III is being done with the 2022 NJDOT grant monies. The Committee agreed they will get an answer from the CFO. (At the time these minutes

were prepared, the Township CFO verified that the Township was notified of the Clean Communities grant funding after the budget adoption and a Chapter 159 Resolution was adopted at the June meeting. Additionally, a Chapter 159 Resolution for the 2023 NJDOT grant monies is included in October's meeting and is for Pierson Road-Section IV.) 4. Status of the Tax Sale Certificates: Deputy Mayor Leady responded the foreclosure attorney began working on it. Mr. Quather suggested the Committee ask for a completion date. 5. Conditions of county roads in the township: Mr. Quather is concerned about a lot of county roads in the township that need repair. He stated the Committee is not holding the County accountable for the conditions of roads in the township. He referenced the recent motorcycle accident on Cohansey-Friesburg Road. Deputy Mayor Leady stated he called the County. Committeeman Morgan stated he called numerous times during the last few years about Alloway-Friesburg Road and finally the County is planning to take care of it after they are done paving Telegraph Road. Mayor McKelvey explained the County has a new procedure. In addition to the municipalities "support" resolution there is now a list of required items that the municipality needs to provide along with the "support" resolution. For example, copies of a Traffic Engineer Study in which the municipality is responsible for the cost. The County will not entertain the request unless all items are provided. 6. Status of the missing "No Turn On Red" sign (6 months ago) and the 4-Way stop sign (3-4 years ago): Mayor McKelvey added the light still has not been fixed. Mayor McKelvey stated the center of town is a safety issue and the County has had the data backing this up.

Mr. Bambrick asked the Committee for an update on his proposal of getting a septic line on Lakeview Drive, as he owns a lot on Lakeview Drive. Mayor McKelvey stated the Committee contacted the Engineer and is waiting for a response. Additionally, though, Committeeman Morgan added that Salem City is trying to sell out their water/sewer utilities to a private company and if that happens there will be a huge increase in the Townships rates. Therefore, this is a big concern to the Township right now.

Kathy Misiewicz asked for an update on the Paradise Lake matter, specifically the fence. The Committee reminded the resident that this matter is in litigation and they cannot provide any more information at this time and as soon as they can, they will. She also asked if the new Township Solicitor is aware of this matter. Mayor McKelvey stated the Solicitor that has temporarily taken over is aware of this matter. She was a partner with the previous Solicitor. Committeeman Morgan stated there really are no changes. Mayor McKelvey shared the Township cannot do anything right now with the fence. She requested the Solicitor attend the next meeting. At this time, Committeeman Morgan gave an update on Block 70, Lot Unassigned.

Mayor McKelvey seeing no one wishing to speak asked for a motion to close the public session. On motion by Morgan, seconded by Leady public session was closed. Vote: All in favor

A motion was made by Committeeman Leady and seconded by Committeeman Morgan to vote by Consent Agenda on Resolutions No. 23-60 to 23-65. Roll Call: Leady-yes, Morgan-yes, McKelvey-yes Motion carried
