

At 5:00 pm the Regular Meeting of the Alloway Township Finance Committee was called to order by P. Ed McKelvey, Mayor. The meeting was advertised in the designated newspapers in accordance with Public Law 1975, Chapter 231. The flag salute was led by Mayor McKelvey.

PUBLIC SESSION: Motion to open Public Session was made by Deputy Mayor Angelus, seconded by Mayor McKelvey

Vote: All in favor-yes

There being no public present, a motion to close Public Session was made by Deputy Mayor Angelus, seconded by Mayor McKelvey.

BILL LIST:

The Township Committee members reviewed the Bill List. With no other questions or comments, the approval sheet for the Bill List was signed.

FINANCE ITEMS:

- Budget- Introduction to the Budget will be on Thursday, April 16
- Reviewed the Proposal for Stockington Road Resurfacing
- Transitioning Banking Institutions

Mayor McKelvey reported that based on the Township Engineer's recommendation, the Committee should postpone the resurfacing of Stockington Road and reapply for the grant this year in hopes of securing additional funding. He also noted that Wistars Mill Lane is scheduled to be resurfaced this coming July.

Lois Yarrington, CFO/QPA informed the Committee that she has transitioned the majority of the Township's funds from Fulton Bank to First Bank, during the process she noticed that the interest rate was slightly lower than expected and after speaking to them, First Bank increased the rate.

OLD BUSINESS/UPDATES:

- DJs Painting completed the flooring in the Tax Assessors Office.
- Wistars Mill Lane Reconstruction to start in July. Mayor McKelvey signed notice to proceed.

NEW BUSINESS/CORRESPONDENCE:

- Mayor McKelvey would like the snow guide rods removed along the roadway on Wistars Mill Lane
- Discussion of Road Projects for 2026
- Formatting CO Application to comply with LEAD Inspection and Fire Inspection- Municipal Clerk Jena Dolbow explained with the adoption of the LEAD inspection ordinance, the Certificate of Occupancy Application will need to be updated. She contacted Oldmans Township, Piles Grove and Carneys Point to obtain copies of their CO applications that already incorporate lead program requirements. Municipal Clerk Dolbow provided these examples to Brett Wolvin, Building/Housing Inspector to review and determine how he would like to update

the structure of the Township's CO application. The revised application will need to include requirements for the fire inspection, specifically related to smoke detectors.

- Draft Resolution-Kirkwood Cohansey Aquifer System- Deputy Mayor Angelus stated this resolution addresses concerns related to the impact of data centers on local aquifers and drinking water resources. While the municipality does not have direct authority over aquifer management, it seeks to formally request that the appropriate governing body reevaluate current policies. The resolution urges state and regional authorities to carefully assess how data center development and operation may affect aquifer sustainability, and to consider implementing stronger protections where necessary.
